What is the EB Visa Program?

Employment-Based (EB) Visas

- **The Immigration and Nationality Act** permits the government to issue 140,000 employment-based visas each year. The 140,000 visas are divided amongst five preference categories (EB-1, EB-2, EB-3, EB-4 and EB-5).
- Once issued, an EB visa allows a foreign worker and his/her family to live and work lawfully in the U.S. as permanent residents.

— Types of EB Visas

Employment-Based Immigrant Visas

EB-1

1. Persons with extraordinary

ability in the sciences, arts, education, business, or athletics. Applicants must have extensive documentation showing sustained national or international acclaim and recognition in their fields of expertise. *

2. Outstanding professors and researchers with at least three years' experience in teaching or research, who are recognized internationally. Must be coming to the U.S. to pursue tenure, tenure track teaching, or a comparable research position at a university or other institution of higher education.

3. Multinational managers or executives who have been employed for at least one of the three preceding years by the overseas affiliate, parent, subsidiary, or branch of the U.S. employer. Applicant's employment

outside of the U.S. must have been in a managerial or executive capacity, and the applicant must be coming to work in a managerial or executive capacity. Labor certification is not required for any of the Priority Worker subgroups.

* "Persons with extraordinary ability" do not need a job offer; can file their own Immigrant Petitions with the USCIS.

EB-2

1. **Professionals holding an advanced degree** (beyond a baccalaureate degree), or a baccalaureate degree and at least five years' progressive experience in the profession. *must provide evidence of degree and work experience

2. **Persons with exceptional ability** in the sciences, arts, or business. Exceptional ability means having a degree of expertise significantly above that ordinarily encountered in the sciences, arts, or business.

*Must meet at least three criteria (see detailed EB-2 outline for more information)

3. **National Interest Waiver.** Aliens seeking a national interest waiver are requesting that the Labor Certification be waived because it is in the interest of the United States. Though the jobs that qualify for a national interest waiver are not defined by statute, national interest waivers are usually granted to those who have exceptional ability and whose employment in the United States would greatly benefit the nation. Those seeking a national interest waiver may self-petition (they do not need an employer to sponsor them) and may file their labor certification directly with USCIS. * Must meet at least three criteria and demonstrate that it is in national interest that you work in the US permanently (see detailed EB-2 outline for more information)

EB-3

1. **Skilled workers** are persons whose jobs require a minimum of 2 years training or work experience that are not temporary or seasonal.

2. **Professionals** are members of the professions whose jobs require at least a baccalaureate degree from a U.S. university or college or its foreign equivalent degree.

3. **Unskilled workers (Other workers)** are persons capable of filling positions that require less than two years training or experience that are not temporary or seasonal.

4. **Labor Certification** Requirement for U.S. employers seeking to employ certain persons whose immigration to the United States is based on job skills or nonimmigrant temporary workers coming to perform services for which qualified authorized workers are unavailable in the United States. Labor certification is issued by the Secretary of Labor and contains attestations by U.S. employers as to the numbers of U.S. workers available to undertake the employment sought by an applicant, and the effect of the alien's employment on the wages and working conditions of U.S. workers similarly employed. Determination of labor availability in the United States is made at the time of a visa application and at the location where the applicant wishes to work.

EB-4

Certain Special Immigrants.

The following special immigrants are eligible for the fourth preference visa:

- Religious Workers
- Broadcasters
- Iraqi/Afghan Translators
- Iraqis Who Have Assisted the United States
- International Organization Employees
- Physicians
- Armed Forces Members
- Panama Canal Zone Employees
- Retired NATO-6 employees

•Spouses and Children of Deceased NATO-6 employees

EB-5

Alien entrepreneurs (and their spouses and unmarried children under 21) are eligible to apply for a green card (permanent residence) if they:

1. Make the necessary investment in a commercial enterprise in the United States; and
2. Plan to create or preserve 10 permanent full-time jobs for qualified U.S. workers.

Capital Investment Requirements

1. General. The minimum qualifying investment in the United States is \$1 million.

2. Targeted Employment Area (High Unemployment or Rural Area). The minimum qualifying investment either within a high-unemployment area or rural area in the United States is \$500,000.

EB-5 Business Entities

Immigrant Investor Regional Centers. In 1992, Congress enhanced the economic impact of the EB-5 program by permitting the designation of Regional Centers to pool EB-5 capital from multiple foreign investors for investment in USCIS-approved economic development projects within a defined geographic region. Today, 95 percent of all EB-5 capital is raised and invested by Regional Centers

EB-1 Visa

The EB-1 visa, also known as "**Employment-Based First Preference**," is an immigrant visa category for "priority workers" seeking permanent residency in the United States. It's considered the most prestigious and competitive employment-based visa due to its high standards and limited availability.

- Types of EB-1 Visas:

There are three distinct categories within the EB-1 visa, each with its own requirements:

1. **EB-1A: Extraordinary Ability:** This category is for individuals with extraordinary ability in the sciences, arts, education, business, or athletics. They must demonstrate sustained national or international acclaim through evidence like major awards, memberships in prestigious organizations, published materials, critical acclaim, etc.
2. **EB-1B: Outstanding Professors and Researchers:** This category is for outstanding professors and researchers who are internationally recognized in their field and have a tenured or tenure-track position at a U.S. university or institution.
3. **EB-1C: Multinational Executives and Managers:** This category is for multinational executives and managers who have been employed by the same company for at least one year in the past three years in a managerial or executive capacity, and are now transferring to a managerial or executive position in the U.S. affiliated company

- Permanent Residency: Allows you to live and work permanently in the U.S.
- Path to Citizenship: After five years (three years for spouses of U.S. citizens), you can apply for U.S. citizenship.
- Family Sponsorship: You can sponsor your spouse and unmarried children under 21 for green cards.

EB-2 Visa

The EB-2 visa, also known as "**Employment-Based Second Preference**," is another immigrant visa category for workers seeking permanent residency in the United States. It's less competitive than EB-1 but still requires significant qualifications and faces processing backlogs.

- Types of EB-2 Visas:

There are two main categories within the EB-2 visa:

1. **EB-2A: Professionals with Advanced Degrees:** This category is for individuals with an advanced degree (Master's or higher) in a field related to the offered job and at least five years of progressive experience in the specialty. Alternatively, a Bachelor's degree with at least ten years of progressive experience in the specialty can qualify.
2. **EB-2B: Professionals with Exceptional Ability:** This category is for individuals with exceptional ability in the sciences, arts, or business, demonstrated through evidence like international acclaim, major awards, significant contributions to the field, etc.

Benefits:

- Permanent Residency: Allows you to live and work permanently in the U.S.
- Path to Citizenship: After five years (three years for spouses of U.S. citizens), you can apply for U.S. citizenship.

EB-3 Visa

The EB-3 visa, also known as "**Employment-Based Third Preference**," is an immigrant visa category for workers with diverse skill levels seeking permanent residency in the United States. It's the least competitive of the EB categories but also has the longest processing times due to high demand.

- Types of EB-3 Visas:

There are three distinct categories within the EB-3 visa, each with its own requirements:

1. **EB-3A: Skilled Workers:** This category is for individuals with at least two years of experience or training in a skilled profession. The profession must require a minimum of two years of training or experience, and the worker must possess the necessary qualifications. Relevant post-secondary education may be considered as training.
2. **EB-3B: Professionals:** This category is for individuals with a U.S. bachelor's degree (or foreign equivalent) and membership in a profession. The profession must require a bachelor's degree and have a national organization with ethical standards and requirements for membership.
3. **EB-3C: Other Workers:** This category is for individuals with less than two years of experience or training in a non-skilled profession. The profession must not be temporary or seasonal, and the employer must demonstrate that qualified U.S. workers are unavailable.

Benefits:

- **Permanent Residency:** Allows you to live and work permanently in the U.S.
- **Path to Citizenship:** After five years (three years for spouses of U.S. citizens), you can apply for U.S. citizenship.
- **Family Sponsorship:** You can sponsor your spouse and unmarried children under 21 for green cards.

EB-4 Visa

The EB-4 visa, also known as "**Employment-Based Fourth Preference**," is an immigrant visa category for a diverse group of individuals considered "special immigrants" seeking permanent residency in the United States. It's subject to a yearly cap and caters to specific categories with unique eligibility requirements.

- Who Qualifies for EB-4 Visa?

Unlike other EB categories based on job skills, EB-4 eligibility is tied to specific occupations or situations:

1. **Religious Workers:** Ordained ministers or religious workers who have worked for at least 2 years in a recognized non-profit religious organization in the U.S.
2. **Special Immigrant Juveniles:** Unaccompanied or abandoned minors granted Special Immigrant Juvenile Status by a U.S. court and seeking permanent residence.
3. **Certain Broadcasters:** Foreign media personnel who have worked for a U.S. media organization for at least 2 years and are essential to the organization's continued operation.
4. **Employees of International Organizations:** Certain retired officers or employees of G-4 international organizations (e.g., United Nations) or NATO-6 civilian employees and their family members.
5. **Certain Employees of the U.S. Government Abroad:** U.S. government employees stationed abroad and their family members.
6. **Members of the U.S. Armed Forces:** Honorably discharged members who served for at least 2 years during war time or for 1 year in peace time, and their family members.
7. **Panama Canal Company or Canal Zone Government Employees:** Former employees of these entities and their family members.
8. **Certain Physicians:** Physicians licensed and practicing medicine in a U.S. state as of January 14, 1998, and meeting specific requirements.

Benefits:

- Permanent Residency: Allows you to live and work permanently in the U.S.
- Path to Citizenship: After five years (three years for spouses of U.S. citizens), you can apply for U.S. citizenship.

EB-5 Visa

The EB-5 visa, also known as the "**Employment-Based Fifth Preference Immigrant Investor Program**," is a unique pathway to permanent residency in the United States for foreign investors. It's designed to stimulate the U.S. economy through job creation and capital investment.

- Things YOU Need to do to apply for EB-5 Visa

1. **Investment Requirement:** You must invest a minimum of \$1,050,000 in a new commercial enterprise that will create or preserve at least 10 full-time jobs for qualified U.S. workers.
2. **Two Investment Options:**
 - **Direct Investment:** Invest directly in a new business you create or manage.
 - **Investment Center:** Invest in a USCIS-approved regional center that pools investments from multiple individuals into various projects. Regional centers offer lower minimum investment amounts (usually \$800,000) but are located in specific geographic areas (often high-unemployment zones).

Benefits:

- Permanent Residency: Obtain a green card for yourself, spouse, and unmarried children under 21.
- Path to Citizenship: After five years, you can apply for U.S. citizenship.
- No Job Offer Required: Unlike other EB visas, you don't need a job offer in the U.S.

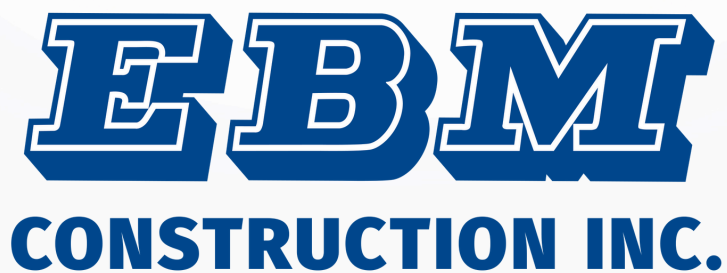

EB-3 Visa for Engineering Professionals



The EB-3 visa category is a path to permanent residency (green card) in the United States for skilled workers, professionals, and certain unskilled workers. Under this category, there's a subcategory specifically for professionals (EB-3B) which can be a good fit for engineering professionals.

Eligibility:

- You must hold a bachelor's degree in engineering or a closely related field, or an equivalent foreign degree. This degree must be the minimum education required for the engineering position you're offered.
- You must have a job offer from a U.S. employer for a full-time engineering position that requires a bachelor's degree in engineering.

— QUOTAS

- The maximum number of visas that can be issued each year under the EB-3 Visa Program is 40,000 (or 28.6% of the EB program maximum of 140,000), plus any of the unused or unissued EB-1 and EB-2 quota for that year.
- No more than 10,000 visas per year can be issued to foreign workers
- under the EB-3 other workers (unskilled) category.

Eligibility criteria for employer

In order to qualify for a visa under the EB-3 Visa Program, the following criteria must be met.



The job position offered must be a permanent full-time position (minimum of 35 hours per week).



The U.S. employer must be able to demonstrate that it has been unable to hire local workers for the position or that it is suffering from chronic turnover.



The U.S. employer must be able to demonstrate that it has the ability to pay the wages of all foreign workers it intends to sponsor.

Reasons Why Employers Utilize The EB-3 Program

- The EB-3 program provides the employer with a strategic initiative it can use to address continuing or endemic labor shortage/turnover challenges. The program is not a “quick-fix” for a temporary labor shortage as the process will take at least 16 to 24 months before foreign workers start arriving at the jobsite.
- Once implemented, the employer is able to create a “pipeline” of foreign workers to supplement its local hiring, thereby adding stability and predictability to its laborsituation.

Advantages of Hiring Foreign Workers



- ✓ Foreign workers are loyal and committed to their employers;
- ✓ Foreign workers typically exceed the qualifications and expectations of their employers;
- ✓ Foreign workers and their family have been fully screened and vetted by the U.S. State Department, FBI., NSA and other U.S. security agencies;
- ✓ Foreign workers and their family have undergone and passed full medical examinations through doctors approved by the U.S. State Department;
- ✓ Foreign workers enter the U.S. as permanent residents and as such immediately qualify under e-verify and will be W-2 employees of your company;
- ✓ There is no need to renew the foreign worker’s visa;
- ✓ There is no minimum employment obligation imposed on the employer and as a result the foreign worker can be terminated, without recourse, at anytime.

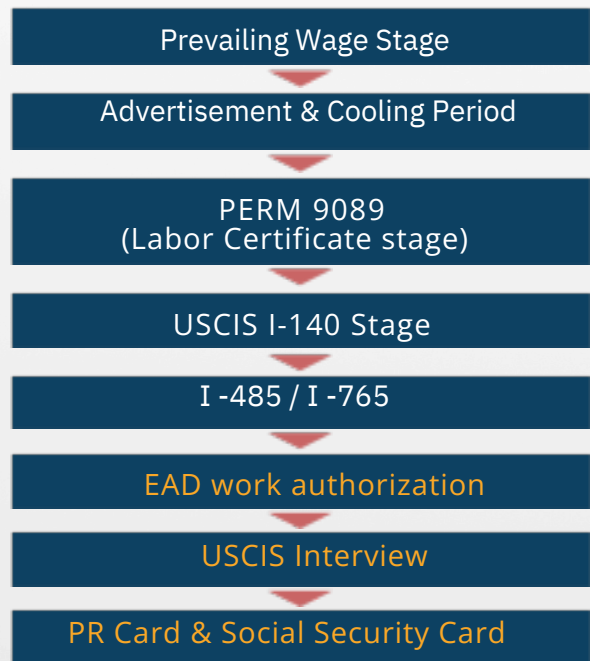

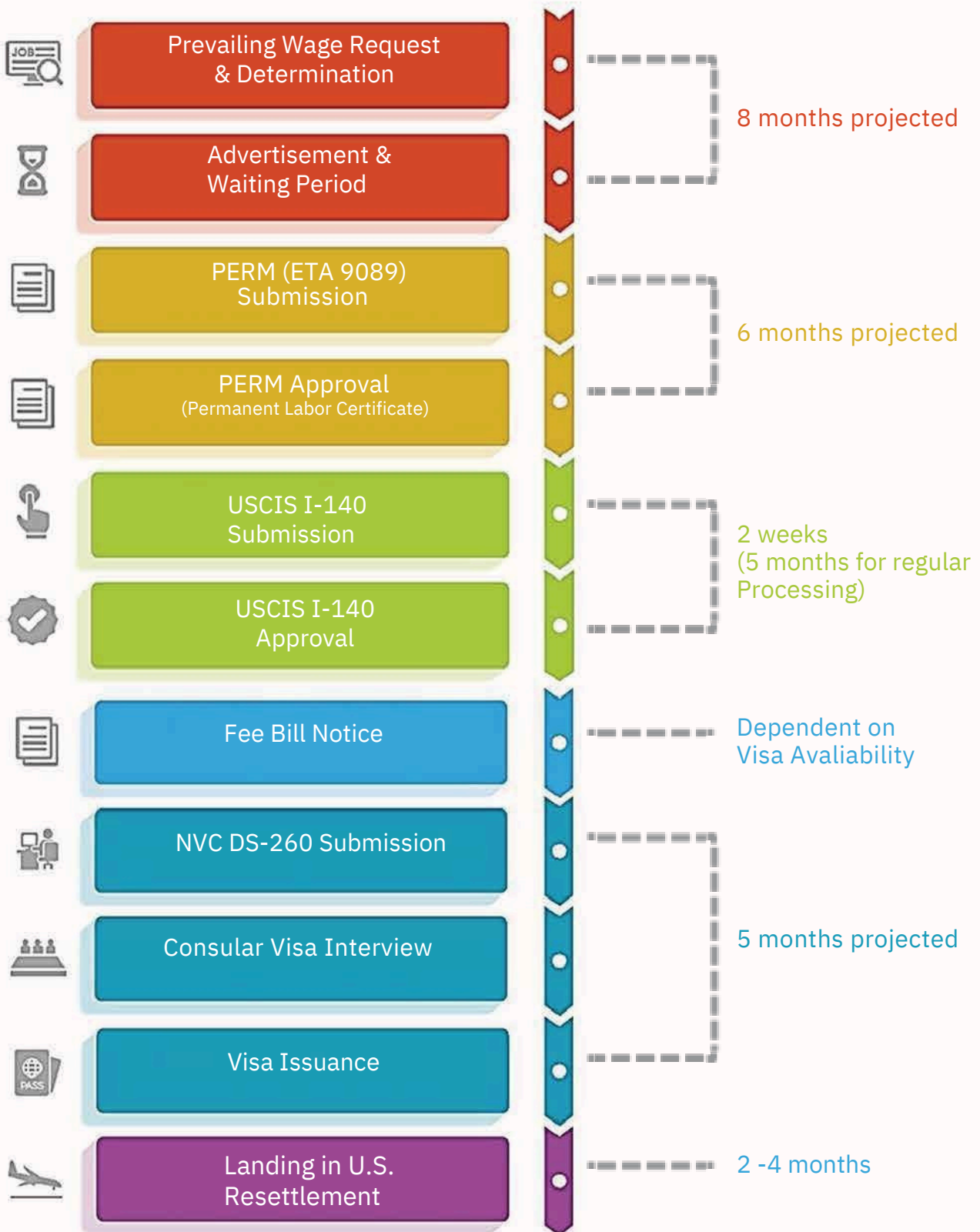

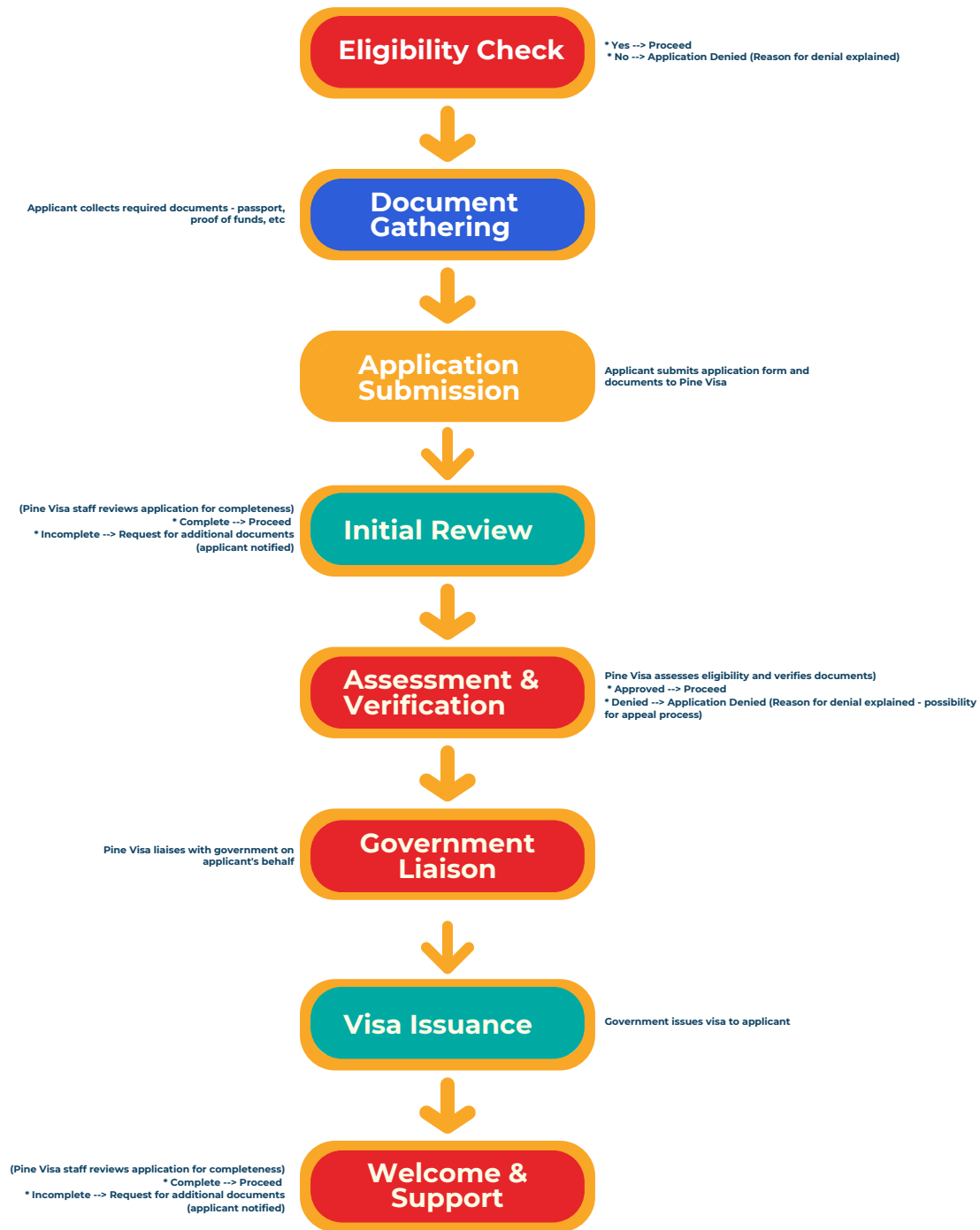
Immigrant worker

If you...

- Are a first preference immigrant worker, meaning you:
 - Have extraordinary ability in the sciences, arts, education, business or athletics, or
 - Are an outstanding professor or researcher, or
 - Are a multinational manager or executive who meets certain criteria
- Are a second preference immigrant worker, meaning you:
 - Are a member of a profession that requires an advanced degree, or
 - Have exceptional ability in the sciences, arts, or business, or
 - Are seeking a national interest waiver
- Are a third preference immigrant worker, meaning you are:
 - A skilled worker (meaning your job requires a minimum of 2 years training or work experience), or
 - A professional (meaning your job requires at least a U.S. bachelor's degree or a foreign equivalent and you are a member of the profession), or
 - An unskilled worker (meaning you will perform unskilled labor requiring less than 2 years training or experience)
